To date, he has released 20 recordings as a leader in addition to contributing to nearly 200 other recording sessions with some of the most notable artists in jazz. He has performed and recorded with Miles Davis, Joe Henderson, Eddie Palmieri, Tito Puente, Frank Sinatra, Joe Lovano and Tom Harrell, among many others.

 - 8:30 pm Coach N' Commando: This duo of Matt Witte-Guitar and John Swayne-Drums bring their raw Juke Joint meets Roadhouse (with a little Punk thrown in) sound to the Old Franklin Schoolhouse for the second time. Veterans of the New Brunswick music scene, the band has released 3 cds to date, and has toured the US many times.
